## Emanuel St. John Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes March 9, 2015

President Dennis Booth called the meeting to order. Present were Pauline Lange, Cindy Souder, Marge Everts, Carol Meyer, Janet Talbott, Randy Souder, Jeff Ellerbrock, Theresa Schultz, LaVerne Arndt, Nicole Meyer, Tim Kral and Pastor Ron. Pastor Ron opened the meeting with a prayer and devotions. Motion by Ron Haden, second by Marge Everts to approve the agenda. Motion passed. Motion by Carol Meyer, second by Marge Everts to approve the February minutes. Motion passed. Rhonda Johnson was not present to go over the February Treasurer's Report. Pauline Lange gave out a draft of the report and Rhonda will give an updated finished report next month. Motion to accept the report with a balance of \$73,783.54. Motion passed. The council received a Youth and Family Report from Leah for EPIC activities for February and March. Motion by Jeff Ellerbrock, second by Ron Haden to loan one free-standing chalk board to the EPIC program through the end of the EPIC program year. EPIC is in charge of moving the board to Rockwell City and returning to our church. Motion passed 6-2.

Old Business: Randy Souder reported on the costs of mops and entryway rugs. Aramark currently provides these items. Motion by Jeff Ellerbrock, second by Theresa Schultz to authorize Randy Souder to purchase disposable mops at a price of approximately six to eight dollars. To purchase three entryway rugs up to \$300.00 for church entryways. Rhonda Johnson will notify Aramark that we will no longer need their services as of May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015. Motion passed. Jeff Ellerbrock will talk to Pastor Ben to find out his opinion on the use of a big screen TV for the church. Jeff gave information on WiFi boosters for the church. The Sunday School has funds and will purchase the booster.

President Report: President Dennis Booth
had LaVerne Arndt give information on the

parsonage repairs. The new pastor and family had some requests.

- 1. Take carpet out of dining room area and put in something laminate since they have three young children. The carpet could go to basement. Cost to complete this project would be around \$400.00. Motion by Ron Haden, second by Theresa Shultz to laminate the dining room floor at the parsonage. Motion passed.
- 2. The basement outside walls need to be waterproofed in order for the basement to be used. LaVerne suggested that the ceiling be painted at the same time. Motion by Ron Haden, second by Carol Meyer to approve Just a Lil Color to waterproof half way on the south and west walls of basement and painting all walls at a cost of approximately \$225.00. Motion passed. Motion by Carol Meyer, second by Marge Everts to approve Just a Lil Color to paint the ceiling at a cost of approximately \$775.00. Motion passed.
- 3. The fireplace is not usable and suggestions were to put in an electric insert or two baseboard heaters like the church has. Motion by Janet Talbott, second by Nicole Meyer to approve Drees Heating to put in an electric insert into the fireplace at a cost of \$2,200.00. Motion passed. The small entryway room between the garage and the house needs a heat source. Motion by Jeff Ellerbrock, second by Carol Meyer to have Drees plumbing install an electric heater at a cost of \$400.00. Motion passed.

The council discussed where the funds to cover the repairs for the parsonage would come from. There are some memorial funds available and possible Endowment funds.

President Dennis Booth reported that Pastor Ben will be moving to Lytton on March 19<sup>th</sup>. LaVerne Arndt has lined up pickups, trailers and men to help with the move. President Booth talked to the insurance company on ways to reduce the premium. He is also looking into Guide One Insurance to see if they can give our church a quote that would be less. President Booth is trying to contact Mike Hiler, EPIC board member to discuss transfers from the CYO checking and savings to EPIC.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ron reported that the confirmation class had their council questioning. Motion by Jeff Ellerbrock

and second by Ron Haden to recommend Heidi Hammen, Sam Musselman, Kaylynn Kruckenberg, and Kylin Kruckenberg to be confirmed into the Emanuel-St. John Lutheran Church. Motion passed. Pastor reported that the confirmands talked about the Devo Devotions and the youth retreats being highlights of their past years of confirmation. Pastor Ron will be moving out of the apartment on April 1, 2015. Financial closure for Pastor Ron was discussed by the board. Pastor will give the board information on any unused sick and vacation time. Jeff Ellerbrock reported that the Endowment committee will match up to \$500.00 for a severance fund for Pastor Ron. Motion by Janet Talbott, second by Theresa Schultz to match the \$500.00 from general fund and that a free will offering also be placed at the farewell party. Motion passed. Dennis Booth will talk to Pastor Ung about setting a time to meet with council on discussing Stewardship.

Worship and Music Committee: Janet Talbott was present. The committee, with Jane Glasnapp's help, has completed the yearly schedule for readers and greeters. Maundy Thursday services will be at 7:00 p.m. Good Friday services will be at 3:00 p.m. Easter Sunrise service is at 6:30 a.m. The committee is looking for music for Palm Sunday.

Parish Education Committee: Theresa Schultz and Nicole Meyer were present. The committee discussed the Easter Brunch. Sunday School Teacher Appreciation day will be May 3.

Outreach Committee: Carol Meyer present. The committee is working on the Pictorial Directory. More time slots may need to be added with another day or starting earlier each day. Having a good turnout of people signing up. March 18<sup>th</sup> will be Pastor Ron's farewell supper and on March 22<sup>nd</sup> there will be a welcome for Pastor Ben and family meal after morning church services.

Property Management: Tim Kral present. He reported a new fence will need to be installed at the south cemetery after the trees are removed. President Booth asked the committee to make sure who ever does snow removal needs to use a shovel to finish scooping out snow away from entry doors.

during announcements at services to inform them of finances.

Jeff Ellerbock announced that if a group would like to do the dinner after the Gala Days Ecumenical Services to let the Endowment committee know. Motion by Marge Everts, second by Ron Haden to adjourn meeting. Motion passed. Lord's prayer.

## A New Parenting Path

When Kalee became a young mom in high school, she knew exactly what kind of parent she *didn't* want to be.

"My childhood was very different," she said. "There was a lot of miscommunication on all levels and yelling all the time. I had a lot of trouble growing up, and I didn't want my kids to go through that."

Instead, Kalee and her partner Shane are finding their own parenting style, thanks to some support from LSI's Families Together program. Families Together is a voluntary home visitation program that offers families parenting education, community resources, support and more.

"Kalee and Shane are so much fun to work with," said Gaylene, an LSI caseworker. "They are very good parents. They just needed a little more confidence in their skills."

For example, the family learned new communication tips to use with their son Gabe, age 4.

"Before we started the program, Shane and I fought a lot about different parenting styles," Kalee said. "We would get frustrated when we couldn't get Gabe to understand what we wanted him to do. We learned how to talk to him better, and now we're on the same page."

Through Families Together, LSI can partner with families at any time from before their child is born up to age 18. On average, an LSI caseworker will meet with a family for 10 – 12 months. That approach, which builds trust and relationships, is comforting, Kalee said.

"Gaylene feels like a part of our family," Kalee said.
"Gabe always asks when she's coming. Having her here also helped prepare Gabe for school."

Kalee hopes her two children will grow up happier than she was, she said.

"I don't think it will be as much of a struggle for them to succeed," she said. "They will feel more secure and loved than I felt growing up."
