

Jesus loves you. All of scripture is either setting the stage for this, telling us this, or explaining how this is so. It is all one story about how God loves his people and goes about trying to get them to understand it.

If we go to the Garden at the very beginning, what do we see? A God who created an entire world and then... he created people to enjoy it. In Abraham, we see a man who was chosen by God in order that he might be blessed and that through him God might bless other people too. In Moses, we see a stern lawgiver, yes, but through him God is establishing a people and a culture into which Christ can be born.

Even as we look at the terrible failures of God's people in the Old Testament, we see the preparations for what is to come. Adam and Eve choose sin. Their kings fail them. Their temple is destroyed because of their own stubbornness and disobedience. Their prophets are ignored and killed. But without these trials and these failures, without a deeply rooted story in which they could be understood and deeply felt, the coming of a savior would not have a meaning that could be grasped.

The Gospels tell us the story of Jesus, focusing almost entirely on the three years at the end of his life, and more specifically still on his last days when he gave up his life. These gospels have fascinated even those who do not believe, but lack any significant meaning until you understand that everything he did was

motivated by love. Theology can be complicated, but what Jesus did was simple. He gave up his life so that those he loved could live. That was the reason for everything.

The rest of the New Testament is simply the story of those first loved ones telling others while they tried to get their minds around what he had done. How could this love be given to people who had not known him? How did this love change their lives? What would happen when the world attacked this love? What would happen when we proved unworthy of it?

All of this, what comes before and what comes after, points back to Jesus. Everything he did, he did because he loved you. Any particular thing might be hard to understand, but it is a part of this whole. That is why scripture means so much. It tells us the story of how God loves us. It tells us in different ways. It tells us with adventure stories, love stories, stories that show what to do, stories that show us what not to do, poems, advice, songs..... Scripture tells us how God loves us in a thousand different ways so that somehow, we might come to believe it.

Supported Community Living into a private family home with a carefully selected mentor. This program

is built entirely around an individual's goals and interests, and LSI's extensive matching process ensures

the mentor and mentee are a great fit.

Take a moment to read the following story from a Host Homes mentee:

"My journey with LSI's Host Homes started in early 2023. I've known my mentor for a few years while he provided hourly services to me. We learned about Host Homes and thought it would be a good fit for

us. I moved into my mentor's home where he helps me maintain a daily routine with schoolwork, household tasks, daily living skills, improving independence, and more.

I attend a college nearby and go to classes a few days a week. I am able to navigate the local bus system to access my community to attend classes and visit friends. My mentor is always available to transport me into the community as needed. This summer, I went on a trip across the country with one of my classes. While on this trip, I was able to

maintain my independence with limited support, but I knew my mentor would be available by phone to assist me with my coping skills and problem solving. This trip was a big success for me knowing I had

support only a phone call away.

I like LSI's Host Homes Program because my mentor supports me in the way I want to be supported,

assists me with some daily tasks I struggle with, and understands me."
